64 Ways to Practice Nonviolence Curriculum (Grade school and high school curriculum)

In 2016, Common Peace continues to market its nonviolence curriculum published in 2008, entitled *64 Ways to Practice Nonviolence*. This powerful and effective teaching tool is a must have for all teachers, students, workshop facilitators, and educators – especially those engaged in the fields of peace, nonviolence, mediation, and social justice. This labor of love was born out of our 1998 *Season for Nonviolence*, our annual 64 day nonviolence campaign, honoring the 64 days between *January 30th and April 4th*, the memorial dates of Mahatma Gandhi and Martin Luther King, Jr. Please go to www.commonpeace.org to read about our nationwide *Season for Nonviolence*, now in its 19th season. 64 Ways to Practice Nonviolence Animation Project

Common Peace is pleased to announce its animation pilot project entitled *Ways to Practice Nonviolence Animation Project* in a variety of Los Angeles classrooms. Using creativity, personal expression, and teamwork, students are educated in the artistry of animation by professional animators and together with their team create PSAs (public service announcements) about nonviolence topics. This project supports participants in understanding and experiencing the basic nonviolence principles in our *64 Ways* Poster and Curriculum.

Nonviolence Summer Day Camp

In the summer of 2012 Common Peace produced its first **Nonviolence Summer Day Camp** held in Pasadena, California. Using puppetry - experienced teachers, nonviolence practitioners, and puppetry maker, Andrea Walker, supported the children in a creative process of exploration and creativity, culminating in a final puppet show performance for their friends and family. The children wrote their own scripts, based on everyday conflicts they were experiencing in their lives, created their storyboards, designed and painted their sets, and performed their scripts with their puppets. Each day of the camp included morning sessions in which the children dialogued with a seasoned nonviolence practitioner about basic nonviolence principles and how to apply those principles in their everyday lives. The morning sessions were based on the Wisdom Circle/Way of Council Circle format, and were followed by puppetry making, music, art, group team building exercises and yoga. We are very excited about the healing potential of this camp. The camp will be offered again in the Culver City area in the summer of 2016. Activities will consist of peace building, yoga, music, theatre, dance, social activism, puppetry, consensus learning, and the creation of animation. Race Relay is a multi-media presentation using drama, music and video to discuss the experience and state of race relations today in America. It is a pilot project for California, to be replicated in cities across the U.S., and is designed to be part of an ongoing effort to further healthy race relations. Utilizing actors, recollections of actual personal incidents, and projected images from various films, **RACE RELAY** is an experiential piece in which the audience participates physically and emotionally. It is a performance that integrates entertainment, reality, humor, and frankness. Weaving together recollections of racial incidents within a dramatic story, and incorporating striking visual images, this multi-media production is designed to invite the audience to examine their feelings and attitudes about race in a non-threatening way.
